South Kitsap 360 - School Facilities from Every Angle

outh Kitsap 360 was a series of three events that brought together a large group representing the community including, but not limited to parents, staff, business owners, students, City and County leaders, service clubs, and school support organizations. The SKSD Board of Directors will consider feedback gathered at the three events as they plan future ballot measures.

The South Kitsap 360 events were educational, informational, and conversational. The first event was held on March 28 at the South Kitsap High School Theatre. More than 220 guests attended the educational presentation hosted by City of Port Orchard Mayor Rob Putaansuu and Sunnyslope Elementary Principal Lisa Fundane't. SKSD brought in expert panelists to share information with the audience. Dr. Brian Benzel covered school finance and budgeting; Tom Ahearne focused on school funding, public education and the McCleary case; Brian Sims talked about school construction and state assistance; Lee Fenton focused on long-range facility planning, school design and construction;

Dr. Nick Brossoit discussed how communities change over time and adding new schools.

The second phase of South Kitsap 360 was a series of informational tours that provided the opportunity for people to visit school sites and see the various facility concerns.

The third event was held on May 14. Participants gathered to review what was learned at the first two events and discussed a series of summarizing questions regarding the future of South Kitsap facilities.

Reginning in the spring of 2015, the state of Washington began giving a new state assessment called the Smarter Balanced Assessment.

Smarter Balanced Assessment is a comprehensive system designed to measure how well students are learning the Washington State K–12 Standards in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics. This assessment is given in grades 3-8 and high school.

SKSD had 97.8% of 3rd-5th graders participate in the SBA ELA assessment and 97.9% in Mathematics. For 11th grade we had a 85.0% participation rate in ELA and 84.7% in Mathematics.

Sunnyslope Recognized as Distinguished School
