

Substitute Paraeducator Job Descriptions

General Ed

Assisting students in a general education classroom.

Preschool

Preschool L& D (possible lifting & diapering)

Special Education services and support are provided through SKSD for eligible preschoolers age 3 through 5 years. Students may receive instruction in "Developmental Preschool Classrooms" or in community preschool classrooms outside the district.

Resource Room

Resource Room One-on-One

Special Education resource staff provides supplemental skill development to students with mild disabilities. These services may be provided within the general education classroom, in a pull-out model, or in a combined model depending on the needs of the individual student.

Life Skills Self-contained

Life Skills Self-contained L & D (possible lifting & diapering)

Life Skills Self-contained One-on-One

The Life Skills classroom provides specialized instruction for special education students with significant developmental delays. Instruction is provided in areas of functional academics, daily living skills, communication and social skills. Students may spend up to half their day in the regular classroom with specialized instruction provided in the life skills classroom.

Early Childhood Autism Program

A modified day program is available for young students with the diagnosis of autism or autism spectrum disorder.

"Triple A" Program

"Triple A" Program L & D (possible lifting & diapering)

The "Triple A" (Achieving Academic Abilities) classroom provides services for students with significant learning disabilities. Students may spend all or part of their school day receiving specially designed instruction in all academic areas.

"Kids In Transition" (KIT)

"Kids In Transition" L & D (possible lifting and diapering)

"Kids In Transition" One-on-One

The "KIT" classroom is an intensive instructional program for students exhibiting serious social, emotional and behavioral disabilities. A highly structured level system is used to reinforce students' skills that allow them to spend increasingly greater amounts of time in classrooms with their peers. A program counselor supports the classroom's social skills program and mental health component.

Community Transition Program (CTP)

This program is for 19 to 21 year old students needing extended transition services into work and the community. The program focuses upon safety and social communication, daily living skills, work training and experience and recreation/leisure activities. The CTP is part of South Kitsap High School programs.

Developmental Kindergarten Program

The Developmental Kindergarten is intended to serve age eligible kindergarten students identified for special education that have more intensive needs than can be served by the resource program at their home school. The program provides one year to work on cognitive, social/emotional, communication, adaptive, and motor skills.
