OTHER SKSD ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Crisis Reality Training implemented for all staff and all schools. Middle and High School students also received training.
- Five schools recognized as Project Lead the Way distinguished schools.
- District awarded \$1.2 million grant to modernize and improve STEM classrooms at South Kitsap High School.
- Supported new teachers with Beginning Educator Support Team and mentor program.
- 318 courses completed with new credit recovery program which keeps students on track for graduation.

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

South Kitsap School District produced a Citizens Guide to the budget to help our community understand where the school district's money comes


