### FREE Supplies!

South Kitsap School District provided essential school supplies for students in grades K-5 again this year!

SKSD is committed to removing barriers to learning and providing equitable access to education for students. Part of that commitment is lessening the financial burden of purchasing school supplies by our families.



## No Athletic & Activity Fees!

To encourage student involvement in athletics and activities and lessen the financial burden on families, South Kitsap School District is waiving all athletic and activity participation fees for the 2022-2023 school year.

Social interactions and engaging in activities help students build a sense of belonging. Students who take part in school activities make memories, build lasting friendships, and learn valuable skills like teamwork, leadership, and handling adversity.

#### School Meals!

The Community Eligibility Program provides free school meals for students at East Port Orchard and Discovery for the 2022-2023 school year. Families with students at all other schools must complete a Free & Reduced Meal Application to qualify. The applications are necessary for certain testing and participation fees to be waived or reduced. They also aid SKSD with the collection of crucial federal program funding. # Progress Continues on the South Kitsap High School Community Pool

The South Kitsap High School Pool Modernization is the largest and most complex project that is detailed in the Capital Project Levy approved by voters in 2018. The needs for the SKHS pool building are extensive to restore the facility to operation.

Work began in March 2022 and the project is now well underway. Demolition of the pool systems, roof and the old movable floor was completed over the summer. The new concrete pool floor has been installed. Structural upgrades to the roof have been completed. Roofing, mechanical and electrical system upgrades are currently ongoing.

The pool project is expected to be open for use in the summer of 2023 and for the 2023-2024 school year.

## Rebuilding South Kitsap Schools



#### Developing the Rebuilding Plan

The newest district facilities are more than 25 years old and many are 50-60 years old. The South Kitsap School Board called for the formation of the committee to consider, develop, and recommend long-term plans for the physical facilities in South Kitsap School District.

The committee of 11 community members held 25 meetings and spent more than 50 hours to compile a thorough report for the Board's consideration. The group recommended priorities for addressing deferred maintenance and planned upgrades to District facilities with benchmarks at a minimum of five years, ten years, twenty-five years, and beyond. Their recommendation for rebuilding South Kitsap is broken down into four categories: replacement, major renovation, minor renovation, or re-purposing

Cedar Heights Middle School, Olalla Elementary and South Colby Elementary are the top priority for replacement using local school bond and state funding based on building condition and overall safety.

#### Next Steps - Bond Steering Committee

The Bond Steering Committee is the next step following the Long Range Facility Planning Committee's work. This District committee is the engine behind the development of a comprehensive bond to take to the community. They will also coordinate the next steps in community engagement and education about any ballot measure. The estimated timeline is for a ballot measure in November of 2023.
